# Region XII Completes Housing Rehabilitation Project in Coon Rapids

Region XII received \$850,000 from the Iowa Home Grant Program for the acquisition and rehabilitation of 5 houses. The first house, located in Coon Rapids, was recently completed and sold to an income eligible, first-time homebuyer. The house was donated to Region XII and seemed a good fit for the program. Rehabilitation included new roof, siding, windows, all interior finishes, mechanical and electrical systems, a completely new bathroom and removal of a wall to make the kitchen and dining space more appealing. On the exterior the original front porch was opened back up to blend in the other historical homes located on the street. Sale proceeds will become part of a revolving fund to acquire and rehabilitate future homes and continue preservation of existing housing stock for years to come.

The Introduction to Planning and Zoning for Local Officials workshop is a session designed to introduce the basic principles of land use planning and development management to elected officials, planning and zoning officials, and board of adjustment members without formal training in the subjects. Using case scenarios in a highly-interactive format, the workshop highlights issues frequently faced in the land use process, such as the roles and responsibilities of the planning and zoning commission, the board of adjustment, and the elected council and board of supervisors. It also will highlight legal issues frequently faced by local officials, such as variances, special uses, nonconforming uses, spot zoning, hearing procedures, and conflicts of interest.
